This guide does not list party affiliation. We don't care whether a person is a Democrat or a Republican. We support people who support us, our Members and our priorities.

IMPORTANT DATES

October 18th

Start of 18-day voting period (through Election Day). Ballots are mailed out and Accessible Voting Units (AVUs) are available at voting centers..

October 28th

Online and mail registrations must be received 8 days before Election Day. Register to vote in person during business hours and any time before 8:00 p.m. on Election Day.

November 5th

Deadline for Washington State voter registration or updates (in person only).

November 5th - General Election

Deposit your ballot in an official drop box by 8 p.m. on Election Day.

If you are registered to vote but missed the opportunity to change your address, you can still vote. Contact the elections division in the county where you are registered to receive your ballot.

Registrations and changes to your registration made after the last day to change your information will take effect for the next election.
