## ANTS

SEE SOMETHING...SAY SOMETHING...

Every month we will focus on specific pests that plague residents here in the Northwest. This month we will focus on ants. With the weather getting warmer you will notice more ants as they come out of dormancy from winter.

Ants will look for food sources that are not properly secured in your home. Food should be kept in closed, tight-fitting containers such as grains and sugar. Grease and spills should be cleaned up as soon as they happen to ensure that there aren't any food sources for the ants. Putting petroleum jelly under the lip of your trash receptacle will help in making it harder for the ants to climb into the garbage for food. Ant baits are also very effective when placed at ant trails or nest openings.

Keeping a clean house can help tremendously in keeping the ants out. There is an attachment that you can look at to reference for ant prevention. Please report all signs to the housing department as soon as you see them. This will ensure that it is taken care of before it becomes an issue.
